

# Northeast Anthony Henday Drive

## Manning Drive & Henday Drive



**2013 WORK:**

- Construction continues as girders are installed for new overpass. Two more half-day detours are anticipated this fall.

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- Becomes an all direction free-flow interchange, with three new ramps and three new bridges.
- Connects NE Henday to existing NW Henday

## Henday Drive & Victoria Trail/ 18 Street

**2013 WORK:**

- 18 Street was closed last fall in order to build new two-lane road with multi-use trail.

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- As part of the brand new Anthony Henday Drive, two three-lane flyover bridges will go over 18 Street/Victoria Trail. Will also accommodate future planned City of Edmonton LRT line.
- When 18 Street reopens, there will be changes to 167 Avenue and Fort Road.

## Henday Drive & North Saskatchewan River

**2013 WORK:**

- No impacts to current travel patterns as this section of Anthony Henday does not exist yet.
- A temporary southside berm was created to begin the first half of bridge construction. This fall, the south berm removed and a north berm installed.

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- Massive twin bridges over the North Saskatchewan River, with four southbound lanes and three northbound lanes.
- A suspended bridge below the four southbound lanes for pedestrians and cyclists.



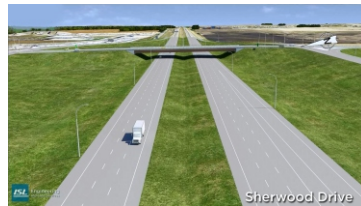
## Yellowhead Trail & Sherwood Drive

**2013 Highlights:**

- Ramp closures occurred in June. Starting in July, there will be a three month closure of both existing access ramps from Yellowhead Trail to Sherwood Drive in order to build new ramps

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- Brand new full-access overpass in four directions, with signal lights. Will allow traffic to travel north-south over Yellowhead Trail.



## Henday Drive & Hayter Road/CNR Yard

**2013 WORK:**

- Continued truck crossings with flaggers and temporary signal lights

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- A new bridge over railway will end train disruption (currently up to 40 minute wait)

## Petroleum Way & Henday Drive

**2013 WORK:**

- Traffic redirected while the first tunnel was demolished
- Traffic will continue to be redirected as construction starts this fall on the new Southbound bridge over Petroleum Way.

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- New Anthony Henday flyover will carry six lanes of traffic over Petroleum Way. Existing Petroleum Way tunnels will be replaced with safer two lane roadway and multi-use trail.



## Henday Drive & Yellowhead Trail

**2013 WORK:**

- Detour continues with minor delays. To minimize disruption, the detour shifts all northbound Anthony Henday lanes (south of Yellowhead) to the existing southbound lanes while still accommodating two lanes in each direction.

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- Major interchange with three layers of smooth free-flow traffic in all directions at Yellowhead Trail and Anthony Henday Drive.

## Baseline Road & Henday Drive

**2013 WORK:**

- Current detour in place. Interim signals and access ramps in place to manage safety.

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- New Anthony Henday overpass over Baseline Road – three lanes in each direction along with access ramps. First stage open by fall 2014.



## Sherwood Park Freeway & Henday Drive

**2013 WORK:**

- Traffic was shifted to the eastbound bridge to accommodate demolition of the westbound bridge over Anthony Henday Drive.
- Permanent closure of 76 Avenue access to Sherwood Park Freeway, to make space for new eastside access ramps.
- To minimize disruption, the northbound Anthony Henday lanes will be shifted in the coming weeks to the existing southbound lanes while still accommodating two lanes in each direction.

**Looking ahead to 2016:**

- Massive new free-flow overpass will have lower speed collector roads, longer ramps and a new flyover to increase safety. First bridge opens to the public in summer 2014.
- Also expands Anthony Henday from two lanes in each direction to three lanes in each direction between Yellowhead Trail and Sherwood Park Freeway.
